Dear Members of First Lutheran,

Over the last few months, I've been using this space to reflect on the proposed mission statement that has come before the congregation. By the time you receive this letter you will have made a decision with regards to it, and I can't say a week before the Annual Meeting what path you will decide to take. What I can share with you, regardless, is where it has taken me. Over the last 6 weeks or so what has really come to the surface for me from the proposed mission statement is the word "sustain."

We say in the proposed mission statement that the work we do as a congregation is meant to "sustain ourselves and our communities." Looking ahead, work toward this end is where I see myself putting a considerable amount of my energy in a three-fold way. The folds would be 1) sustaining ourselves as individuals, 2) sustaining our building and staff, and 3) sustaining our communities. Though presented and started in this order, I want to emphasize, there is a need to start the next step before completing the previous one, or we'll never get anywhere. You can feel free to read that, "We'll need to start the next step before we really feel ready to do so, or we'll just keep navel gazing.

With that caveat, I'd like to spend the rest of my time in this newsletter talking about sustaining ourselves. Keep in mind, that I say this as a work in progress myself, but if any of the following phrases resonate with you, "I'm tired of the run around, I'm tired physically, I hurt for no apparent reason, I'm too busy, I'm stressed, I'm lost, I'm lonely, I feel out of control, I feel like there has to be more to life than this," then there is something out of balance and unsustainable in the way you are living.

That's not judgement, that's simply a fact; a fact that if you're honest with yourself you know or feel already, it's just not fun to have it pointed out. What you might not have heard, though, because our world is so good at asking you to join its misery is this, "This is not God's intention for us, nor is it what Jesus means by having an abundant life." It's also a prime opportunity for us to witness to others that life can be different than the overstuffed rat race we've gotten used to.

I say this because, our faith tradition has filled and continues to add to its tool box, practices too numerous to be counted. These practices can help us sort out our priorities and work to live by them. They can help us see and learn how to let go of the things that are burdening us the most. They can help us regain and recover what we expend through our days, and help us get back to normal more quickly when a stressful week arises.

Now, if you are thinking this sounds like more than just a once a week on Sunday proposition, you are absolutely correct. Think about this for a moment though, our physical bodies would perish if we only ate one meal per week, yet we expect our spiritual bodies to flourish on such rations; this doesn't make sense. If we want our spiritual selves to flourish we must feed them regularly. To do that, we must proactively and deliberately feast through the week on those things that feed us instead of hoping they come on Sunday and if they don't going home with a hunger pang. What that looks like in practice is if Sunday's music doesn't hit you with all the right notes, you feed yourself through the week with music that lifts you up. If the visuals weren't inspiring, you take a walk around the PAC and feed your soul. If the sermon falls flat, you take a book from the church library and get some good theology to chew on.

With such practices, Sunday becomes dessert, the extra portion you don't really need but you're looking forward to and saving some room for, and it sure tastes good. Sunday isn't the only thing that changes though. As we work on sustaining ourselves, the model of church changes as a whole, it changes from the place that we look to feed us all we need in one big lump to a place of learning, experiencing, and reflecting with others, so we can eat more regularly in other places in our lives as we continue practicing what we have learned there.


New Business:
