The Visitor March

Years ago in the classroom portion of Driver's Ed, I was warned to watch out for "Velocitization." Our instructor said, this was the term for the tendency of slowly speeding up when driving long distances, and then also having difficulty slowing down and staying at the speed limit on lower speed roads when you exited a long stretch of highway. "Yeah sure", I thought. That was until the first time I took an interstate road trip at 65 MPH and then exited onto a long straight highway with a 55 MPH limit. On both roads, I kept looking down and seeing the speedometer creeping past 65 on its way to 70.

What I've noticed of late is that it's not only driving where I get velocitized, I do it as well with the pace of life in general. I have observed that I have a tendency to pick up a task here and another task there and then I get used to the pace and something else that feels like an opportunity presents itself and I pick it up as well, and it all works itself into a routine that I tell others, "you get used to." Then a break happens, something gets cancelled, a snowstorm shuts things down, my stressed body tells me I had better set a hobby down for a while, and though you might think a break would be welcome, what I've noticed about myself is how stuck in "go" I am. When suddenly given a different "speed limit," I am antsy, I pace around the house, I feel like something is missing and I need to fill it. What all this is about is, I'm really trying to get back to the pace of life I'm used to, so I can get the rush of adrenaline that I've gotten used to running on.

If this is sounding familiar to you, and from conversations I've been in, I share this confident that I am not alone; I'm going to say this out loud for all of us. This is not healthy, and as I wrote those last couple sentences, I couldn't help but notice, those are withdrawal and addiction behaviors.

As an opportunity to shift your habits, to slow down intentionally, and hopefully pick up a new practice or two that you can use to get out of the fast lane more regularly I present to you: Lent. A time of fasting, which is also an opportunity to fast from a hectic pace of life, which is a better and perhaps more difficult fast than giving up chocolate.

At First Lutheran, on Lenten Wednesdays, Feb 21-March 20 you have an opportunity to slow down for the night. Meals will be provided so you can take the night off from cooking. In our worship service, we will sit with our Mission Statement and reflect on the "Way of Jesus" as seen in the book of Mark. The service itself is being designed to offer time for reflection and to learn songs and prayer practices that you can use in your daily life to help slow down and stay slowed down through the rest of the week. Following the service, Pr. Breen is offering an opportunity to process, converse, and stitch as you are formed into new people by "Stitching Ourselves Together." You can learn more about this deeper in the newsletter.

In addition to these opportunities to learn new expressions of faith and step out of the busy world, The Episcopal Church of our Savior is hosting Stations of the Cross and a soup lunch on Wednesdays. More about this later in the Newsletter as well. First Presbyterian will also be putting out a labyrinth in their social hall which you can walk 9-4 during Holy Week. If you lack time during the week, you could also come a little early for Good Friday Services there. Understanding that these might be new practices for you, I will be offering some online resources on our website to help you know what to expect and how you might use these traditional practices to grow in your walk of faith. I will also be working on online resources to help guide you in continuing to use the prayer practices presented at Wednesday Evening worship. I hope that Lent can be a time for you to find a new speed, one that is more sustainable and leaves you with time to notice the presence of God in your life.



Lenten Opportunities





Indoor labyrinth


